GAME HIGHLIGHTS:

- After blowing a 17-point first half lead, the Thunder found themselves trailing 66-70 heading into the 4th quarter. In the final period, OKC shot 66.7% (12-18 FG's) and outscored MEM 36-24 in the final 12 minutes of regulation. The 36 4th quarter points matches a Thunder season-high.
- The Thunder outscored MEM 24-6 through the first 7:52 of the fourth quarter.
- The Grizzlies dominated the 3rd quarter by holding OKC to a season-low 10 points on 15.0% shooting (3-15 FG's). During the lopsided 3rd quarter, Zach Randolph set a Grizzlies franchise record by pulling down 13 of his game-high 20 rebounds. The 20 rebounds by Randolph is the most allowed by OKC since 12/5/08 (Dwight Howard; 23).
- Kevin Durant posted his fifth double-double with 32 points to go along with 10 rebounds. This was KD's ninth 30-plus scoring game of the season (6-3 record).
- Nenad Krstic recorded 15 points (7-10 FG's) and eight rebounds. The Thunder is 8-2 when Krstic scores in double-figures.
- By holding Memphis to 94 points, the Thunder is a perfect 10-0 when holding their opponent to fewer than 100 points.
- OKC committed 14 turnovers. The Thunder is 7-3 this season when committing 15 or fewer turnovers.

GAME HIGHLIGHTS:

- OKC held GS to a season-low 88 points scored as the Thunder outscored the Warriors 54-39 in the second half while limiting GS to 38.9% (14-36 FG's) in the final two periods.
- Thunder rookie James Harden came off the bench to score a season-high 26 points to go along with a career-high nine rebounds and a game-high five assists. For the second time this season, Harden single-handedly outscored the opposing team's bench (26-15).
- OKC took a decisive 57-37 rebounding advantage including a 15-3 edge on the offensive end of the floor. The 57 rebounds represents a season-high for the Thunder.
- Jeff Green finished with his fourth double-double of the season as he posted 21 points to go along with a game-high 13 rebounds (one shy of season-high). Additionally, it was the 3rd time this season Green recorded 20+ points scored (Thunder 3-0 in such contests).
- For the 18th time this season, OKC utilized the starting lineup of Durant, Green, Krstic, Sefolosa and Westbrook (OKC posts 11-7 record).
- GS rookie Stephen Curry set a career-high with 22 points on 9-of-14 shooting on the night.

GAME HIGHLIGHTS:

- Seven BOS players recorded double-figure scoring totals (only two for OKC), as the Celtics handed Oklahoma City their largest defeat of the season (18 points).
- The Thunder allowed the Celtics to shoot an opponent season-high 56.5% (39-69 FG's) including 9-of-17 shooting from behind the 3-point arc. Meanwhile, OKC converted only 3-of-17 3-point field goals on the night (17.6%).
- For the eighth time this season, Kevin Durant reached the 30-point scoring plateau (5-3 record). When he was taken out of the game at the 6:23 mark of the 4th quarter, KD had scored 36 (13-19 FG's) of the Thunder's 74 points.
- With the win, BOS swept their four-game road trip (eight-game win streak overall), while improving their road record to a 9-1 mark.
- In 26 minutes of action, Kevin Garnett missed only one-of-eleven shots to finish with a team-high 23 points and eight rebounds.
- OKC was outrebounded by a 30-40 margin. The 30 rebounds for Oklahoma City represents a season-low. The Thunder was outrebounded by 10+ for the third time this season (0-3 record).

OKLAHOMA CITY THUNDER NOTES

Select Company: Only three players in NBA history have gone onto average 28.0 points or more through the first 21 games of a season at age 21 or younger. All three of these individuals will take part in tonight's Thunder vs. Cavaliers match-up. By averaging better than 28.0 points per game through his first 21 contests this season, Kevin Durant (28.3 ppg) joins LeBron James (30.5 ppg, 2005-06 season) and Shaquille O'Neal (28.6 ppg, 1993-94) as the only players in NBA history to accomplish such a scoring feat at age 21 or younger.

KD En Fuego: By scoring a game-high 32 points on Friday night versus the Memphis Grizzlies, KD has now scored 25 or more points in seven straight games. Last season, Durant pieced together two seven-game streaks in which he recorded 25-plus points. On the season, KD has posted 18 scoring efforts of 25 or more which is tied for the MOST in the NBA (Carmelo Anthony). LeBron James is currently third on the list with 16 games of 25+ points scored. During the most recent seven Thunder contests, KD is averaging 30.7 points on 49.3% shooting (95.0% free throw shooting; 57-60).

Race to 4,000...and Beyond: Kevin Durant, the NBA's 3rd leading scorer (28.3 ppg) became the second youngest NBA player (behind LeBron James) to reach 4,000 career points scored as he knocked-down a 17-foot jump shot midway through the first quarter during the Thunder's recent contest versus the Boston Celtics (12/4). It took Durant all but 173 games played in his young career to reach the 4,000-point plateau. Based on his current scoring clip, Durant is on pace to reach the 5,000 career points list later this season at Minnesota (2/21).

New and Improved: Through the first six weeks of the NBA season, Thunder second-year guard Russell Westbrook has shown an improved all-around game. During his first 21 contests, Westbrook is averaging 16.4 points, 6.9 assists and 4.7 rebounds in 34.4 minutes per game. Only a select number of NBA players have maintained such averages throughout the course of an entire season. Below is a list of those second-year players to average 16-plus points, 6-plus assists and 4-plus rebounds during their sophomore NBA seasons.

Winning with D: With their 102-94 victory over the Memphis Grizzlies two nights ago, the Thunder ranks 6th in the NBA by allowing 95.0 points per game (allowed 103.1 points per game last season). The Thunder has held their opponent to 90 points or fewer in eight-of-twenty one games this season (7-1 record in such contests). Oklahoma City also ranks 7th in opponent field goal percentage by allowing their opposition to shoot 44.4%. Lastly, Defense is quickly becoming the trademark during Thunder victories this season. In the twelve Thunder wins (SAC, DET, ORL, LAC, SA, MIA, WAS, UTA, MIL, PHI, GS and MEM), OKC is allowing only 90.8 points per game on 42.5% shooting.

Road Warriors: With their win over the Heat in Miami (11/17), the Thunder won three straight road contests in the first month of the season. As a point of reference, the OKC franchise failed to win three consecutive road contests in each of the last two seasons. With ten road games already under their belt, OKC owns a 6-4 road away from the Ford Center after their 102-94 victory versus the Grizzlies in Memphis on 12/11. Last year, the Thunder won a total of eight road contests and it took OKC until March 22nd (at MIN) before the team would claim their sixth road win. With a .600 road winning percentage, the Thunder is one of six NBA teams with a better road versus home winning percentage.

Century Mark: On December 2nd versus the Philadelphia 76ers, Thunder guard Russell Westbrook notched his 100th career game in memorable fashion. In 34 minutes played vs. Philly, Westbrook recorded a season-high 15 assists, marking the 14th time in his career in which he has reached double-figure assist totals. By posting 11 double-doubles (points and assists) through his first 100 career contests, Westbrook becomes one-of-twelve active players to have accomplished the feat. He joins the likes of Jason Kidd, Chris Paul, Allen Iverson and Deron Williams by posting 11-plus double-doubles comprised of points and assists through his first 100 career games played.

KD in Rarified Air: With his 28-point performance on 11-of-22 shooting versus the Jazz in Utah, Kevin Durant became just the fourth player in league history, joining LeBron James (twice), Shaquille O'Neal and Michael Jordan, to score at least 400 points during the first 15 games of a season at age 21 or younger. Red-hot scoring streaks are not unfamiliar territory to Durant. Last season prior to his injury at Dallas (2/27), Kevin Durant found himself on a scoring tear seldom witnessed by a second year NBA player. In the 17 games prior to his injury (1/16 vs. DET through 2/24 vs. LAL), Durant posted a scoring average of 32.3 points per game. During this five-week long span, Durant led the NBA in scoring by a 2.4 point per game margin (LeBron James; 29.9 ppg). It had been 35 years since a second-year player last averaged 32+ points across a 17-game span (Bob McAdoo; 34.7 ppg during the 1974 season).

Youth Movement: The Thunder entered the 2009-10 season as the second youngest team in the NBA with an average age of 25 years and 130 days (as of opening night). They trail only the Memphis Grizzlies who boast an average age of 25 years and 92 days. Additionally, the OKC opening night (10/28) starting lineup (Durant, Green, Krstic, Sefolosha and Westbrook) was the youngest in the league with an average age of 23 years and 179 days. For a matter of comparison, the age of the average NBA roster is 26 years and 329 days and the oldest team in the league entering the 2009-10 season was the San Antonio Spurs with an average age of 29 years and 73 days. There are currently eight players on the Thunder roster age 23 or younger.

Filling up the Ford: The Thunder began the 2009-10 season right where they left off... with another sellout. Those that made up the capacity crowd of 18,203 on opening night (10/28) in Oklahoma City were greeted with a new and improved Ford Center. As part of a taxpayer funded initiative passed in March 2008, numerous arena improvements were recently completed. The Ford Center now boasts a state-of-the art scoreboard, new terrace suites and a courtside club to go along with a new and improved Thunder locker room. Last season, fans from near and far flocked to Oklahoma City to witness Thunder basketball. During the Thunder's inaugural season in OKC, the Ford Center recorded 18 sellouts (19,136) including eight consecutive to end the season. In 41 home games, the Thunder's average attendance topped the 18,700 mark (11th best in the NBA), accounting for an average capacity of nearly 98.0%. This season, the Thunder has sold-out seven of their first eleven home contests. The Thunder is drawing an average crowd of 17,884 through the first five weeks of the 2009-10 season (98.3% capacity).

Harden Heats Up: After failing to record double-figure scoring totals during his first 11 NBA games, OKC rookie James Harden broke-out to score 10+ points in six of the last ten Thunder contests (including five straight from 11/18-11/27). Including his career-high 26 points and nine rebound effort vs. GS on 12/7, Harden is averaging 13.6 points on 43.0% shooting including 39.0% shooting from behind the 3-point arc (16-41) through his last ten games. During OKC's win versus the Washington Wizards on 11/20, Harden came off the bench to record his previous season-high 25 points on 8-of-11 shooting as he single-handedly outscored the Wizard's reserves (25-20). In the Thunder match-ups vs. Orlando (11/18) and Washington (11/20), Harden connected on 10-of-13 3-point field goals including seven consecutive makes during this two-game stretch. The seven consecutive makes ties a rookie record for the most consecutive 3-pointers converted by a first-year player since Michael Dickerson made eight straight for the Houston Rockets (5/4/99-5/5/99). His six 3-point makes at Orlando (11/18) tied a rookie franchise record (Rich Frahm; 12/20/03).

Defending When it Matters: During the Thunder's 83-79 victory over the Los Angeles Clippers (11/11) at STAPLES Center, OKC held the Clippers to just 10 4th quarter points on 15.8% shooting (3-19 FG's). The 10 points surrendered in the 4th quarter is the fewest allowed since the 2006-07 season when the OKC franchise held the New Orleans Hornets to an all-time franchise low six 4th quarter points. Through the first 21 games of the season, the Thunder is limiting their opponents to 22.2 points during the final 12 minutes of regulation. In the twelve Thunder wins, OKC opponents are shooting just 40.6% (91-224 FG's) in the fourth quarter.

Strong back-2-back Showings at the Ford: With their 127-108 victory over the Wizards on 11/20 and their 108-90 win over the Milwaukee Bucks on 11/27, the OKC franchise won back-to-back home games by 18-plus points for the first time since November of 2004 (Nov. 5th - 10th). During this two-game home tear, the Thunder averaged 117.5 points on 50.3% shooting (48.6% 3-point shooting). The 127 points scored versus the Wizards on 11/20 was the most recorded in regulation (excluding overtime) by the OKC franchise since February 21st, 2001 (127-98 win vs. DEN).

First Impressions: With their 102-89 victory over the Sacramento Kings on October 28th, the OKC franchise secured their first opening night victory since 2003 when they defeated the Los Angeles Clippers 109-100 in Saitama, Japan. During the Thunder's wire-to-wire win at the Ford Center, Russell Westbrook set a career-high with 13 assists to go along with 14 points and seven rebounds. With his 13 assists, Westbrook single-handily matched the entire assist total for the entire Kings team. The last time an OKC franchise player matched the entire opposing team's assist total occurred in 2006 when Luke Ridnour handed-out 13 assists in a 110-106 defeat vs. the Portland Trail Blazers. With their most recent win vs. GS (12/7), the Thunder enters tonight's contest versus the Cavaliers with a record of 12-9 which is the best start for the OKC franchise through the first twenty one games since the 2004-05 season when the team started the season with a record of 17-4.

Early Returns: After recording double-figure assist totals nine times during his rookie season (2008-09), Russell Westbrook has already posted five 10-plus assist performances through the first six weeks of the season. Westbrook, who currently ranks 8th in the NBA with 6.9 assists per game, has increased his assist total after averaging 5.2 apg during his rookie season. Oklahoma City is 5-0 this year when Westbrook records 10+ assists.

Perfection from the Stripe: During OKC's loss to the Sacramento Kings (11/10), Kevin Durant recorded a game-high 37 points in large part due to his efficiency from the charity stripe. Durant set a franchise record by converting 18 made free throws without a miss (also a NBA season-high). Setting all-time franchise records from the free throw line is not unfamiliar to Durant. Last season versus the Los Angeles Clippers (1/23/09), KD converted 24 made free throws (on 26 attempts) en route to a 46-point performance at STAPLES Center. Durant's 24 made free throws set a Thunder franchise record. In addition, Durant set a NBA season-high for most FT's made during the 2008-09 season. In doing so, Durant became one of only four players over the last 20 years to convert 24+ FT's in a single game (MR; LeBron James: 24-of-28 on 3/12/06).

Back-2-Back Sets: The Thunder enter tonight's game versus Cleveland on the first night of their fourth back-to-back of the year. With their game in Orlando on November 18th, the Thunder closed-out the third of 18 back-to-back sets this season. OKC secured splits in each of their first three back-to-back match-ups this year. So far this season, the Thunder is 2-1 on the first night of a back-to-back and 1-2 on the second night. Last season, the Thunder posted an 8-28 record in their back-to-back pairings (3-15 in first game, 5-13 in second game).

Let the Balloting Begin: Thunder forward Kevin Durant, forward Jeff Green and guard Russell Westbrook all appeared on the 2010 NBA All-Star Ballot which was unveiled last month during a special tip-off event in Dallas, the Official Host City of NBA All-Star Weekend 2010. Voting will take place at all Thunder home contests at the Ford Center for games played between Sunday, November 15 vs. the LA Clippers and all the way through Oklahoma City's match-up with Indiana on January 9th. The Thunder trio can also be voted-in via online balloting at thunder.nba.com which begins immediately and continues on through January 18. The 2010 NBA All-Star Game will be played at Cowboys Stadium in Arlington, Texas, before an expected crowd of more than 80,000 – the largest group ever to witness a live basketball game, on Sunday, Feb. 14, 2010.

Technically Speaking: With three (individual) technical fouls called through the first twenty one games of the 2009-10 season, the Thunder continue their run of being one of the fewest "T'd-Up" teams in the league. During the 2008-09 season, 11 individual technicals (excludes defensive technicals) were whistled on Thunder players and coaches. This total was the fewest awarded to any NBA team during the season. In addition, the Thunder committed 31 total technical fouls (includes individual and defensive 3-second technicals) which tied for the fewest in the NBA (San Antonio). This total also represents the fewest "T's" committed in the NBA since the 1997-98 season (Golden State; 22).

Lots of Magic at the Ford Center: During the Thunder's 102-74 victory over the Orlando Magic on November 8th, OKC held ORL to 30 second half points on 29.4% field goal shooting (10-34 FG's). The 28-point margin of victory represents the largest Thunder win in Ford Center history. In knocking-off last season's Eastern Conference Champions, the Thunder shot a season-high 57.1% while handing-out a season-best 27 assists. Meanwhile, Orlando shot a season-worst 36.8% while converting a season-low 25 made field goals. Orlando was held to fewer than 75 points for just the third time in the last three-plus seasons. With the victory, the Thunder notched their third win of the year. It was not until December 19th of last season (vs. TOR) before the Thunder would claim their third win.

What Lazy Days of Summer?: The Thunder was the only NBA team to participate in multiple summer leagues this past off-season. Seven players currently on the Thunder roster saw action in the Orlando Pro Summer League (July 5-10) and the NBA Summer League in Las Vegas (July 10-19). Thunder second-year guard Russell Westbrook and OKC Rookie James Harden were both named to the 2009 Orlando Pro All-Summer League First-Team. In addition, Thunder forward D.J. White received second-team honors for his performance in Orlando. In four Orlando Summer League contests Westbrook posted averages of 22.3 points (.519 FG%), 3.5 rebounds and 7.8 assists in 32.3 minutes per game. Harden, the No. 3 overall selection in this past summer's NBA draft participated in a total of nine summer league contests and recorded averages of 14.7 points (.506 FG%), 3.3 rebounds and 2.4 assists in 27.9 minutes per game.

Country First: The OKC trio of Kevin Durant, Jeff Green and Russell Westbrook were all invited to participate in the 2009 USA Basketball Men's National Team mini-camp held in Las Vegas this past July. In preparation for the 2010 World Championships and the 2012 Olympic Games in London, USA basketball hosted the three-day event which included an intra-squad Blue vs. White scrimmage on the final day. Thunder Head Athletic Trainer, Joe Sharpe was also invited to participate in the Team USA event.

Summer Oversees: Both Nenad Krstic (Serbia) and Thabo Sefolosha (Switzerland) spent the summer months representing their counties as they competed in the 2009 EuroBasket Championships held in Poland. While Sefolosha and Switzerland participated in the Division B bracket, Krstic helped lead the Serbia team to the Championship Game vs. Spain in the upper Division A bracket. In nine EuroBasket contests, Krstic posted averages of 13.4 points, 4.8 rebounds and 1.6 assists in 23.4 minutes per game. Meanwhile, Sefolosha played in four games for the Swiss team and compiled averages of 15.8 points, 6.5 rebounds and 3.3 assists in 37.3 minutes per contest.

Durant Dazzles: Through his first two NBA seasons, Kevin Durant has already proven that he is one of the elite scorers in the game. Durant, the NBA's 6th leading scorer last season, averaged 25.3 points in just his second season removed from the University of Texas. He became the NBA's 5th second-year player in the last 20 years to average better than 25 points per game.

Not "Two" Shabby: After two seasons in the NBA, Kevin Durant boasts a 22.7 scoring average, the fifth highest career average for any second year player in the modern era (dating back to 1989). Only Shaquille O'Neal (26.4), David Robinson (25.0), LeBron James (24.1) and Vince Carter (22.9) posted higher career scoring averages after their first two NBA seasons.

Sophomore Studs: At the end of last season, second year players Kevin Durant and Jeff Green combined to average 41.8 points per game. The last pair of second year teammates to average a higher total was Allen Iverson and Jerry Stackhouse for the Philadelphia 76ers who more than a decade ago combined to average 44.2 points per game during the 1996-97 season

Young Guns: During the 2008-09 season, the Thunder registered a majority of their scoring from either first or second year players. In fact, OKC rookies and second year players combined to score 4,780 of the 7,952 total Thunder points. This total represents 60.1% of the OKC points scored, the highest percent of any team in the NBA during the 2008-09 season. The last team with a higher percentage of points coming from rookies and second year players occurred during the 1997-98 season when the Boston Celtics received 68.7% of their scoring from a young team which included the likes of Antoine Walker, Ron Mercer, and Walter McCarty.
